

The Episcopal Succession of the
**REFORMED EVANGELICAL
SYNOD OF AMERICA**

2009 Edition

The 32nd Article of Religion states the Reformed Evangelical Synod of America's understanding of the vital importance of the Apostolic Succession or "Historic Episcopate" in the life of Christ's Church:

The Scriptural norm for the transmission of ministerial authority is rooted in the laying on of hands by the apostles, together with prayer. Throughout history, the Church has maintained this line of tactile succession as a witness to the lawful transmission of ministerial authority through the bishops of the church (known as the historic episcopate) in ways adapted to local needs. To be valid though, the historic episcopate assumes that the lawful transmission of ministerial authority is combined with faithful transmission of the Apostolic Teaching of the New Testament. At crucial junctures in church history, the link between tactile succession and faithfulness to the Gospel has been perversely severed. In such cases, the faithful were forced, out of loyalty to Christ, to follow apostolic teaching instead of the faulty witnesses of those with a claim to being in succession from the apostles.

We serve the God who is faithful to the thousandth generation of those who love Him and keep His commandments. As such we believe the historic episcopate to be an important witness to the faithfulness of God in establishing the reign of Jesus Christ across the nations and through the generations, filling the earth with Christ's Glory. Because, by grace, this historic episcopate seeks to maintain the lawful transmission of ministerial authority together with the faithful transmission of Apostolic Teaching, all who assume ministerial work within this Synod shall enter into their ministry through the laying on of hands by a bishop in the historic episcopate. (Historically, diaconal consecration has been handled in various ways. While the laying on of hands is generally performed by a bishop, deacons and deaconesses in this Synod may be consecrated by presbyters with the consent of the bishop.)

This record makes public the Apostolic lineage of the Reformed Evangelical Synod of America at its founding. We humbly receive this historic episcopate as divine gift, holy charge, and as a daily reminder that all our hope is in Him who has been faithful through these successive apostolic generations, even in spite of their failings and, sadly, at times through their falsehoods.

While giving thanks to God for his kindness in preserving the Historic Episcopate in our midst, we also do well to heed the admonition of Saint Paul in his letter to the Romans (chapters 9-11), where he reminds us of the danger of finding ourselves to be a people with an impeccable lineage and even remarkable zeal for certain religious matters but devoid of the true knowledge of and communion with Jesus Christ, the Saving Lord of History. Accordingly, we pray that the Sovereign Lord who has called us with a holy calling, and imparted to us all the gifts of the Church's holy heritage – the Word, the Sacraments, and these Fathers in the faith – may deliver us from all boasting except those boasts we make for Christ's Great Name. May we acquit ourselves as those who, surrounded by so great a cloud of holy witnesses, daily sense the supreme burden and obligation that rests upon us, this new generation of the stewards of the mysteries of God.

Enable us, Faithful Lord, to ever know You and Jesus Christ whom You have sent so that in the power of the Holy Spirit we gladly offer ourselves as living sacrifices for your good pleasure at all times and in all places. On the Last Day, raise us to life everlasting through Jesus Christ our Lord who has been made for us all wisdom, righteousness, sanctification and redemption. Amen.

Notes:

- 1) Most papal/patriarchal records show succession of office, which sometimes is and sometimes is not reflective of who consecrated who. At certain points in the lines, however, specific documentation for individual consecrations becomes available - usually when the succession record reflects the consecration of a bishop who did not serve as a patriarch/pope. Every effort has been made to present this lineage faithfully and clearly based on the testimony of those from whom we have received this succession.
- 2) Several of the Episcopal lineages laid out in this document are shared among the various consecrators of Bishop Huckaby, and are only provided once. Only the main lines of succession are provided in this document. Numerous other successions (with varying degrees of credibility) could also be claimed through the co-consecrators of Bishop Huckaby; these are noted at the conclusion of this document.

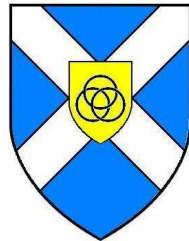
